William Russell was born in London in 1965 and educated at Eton College and Durham University. He took office as the 692nd Lord Mayor of the City of London on 8th November 2019. His mayoral theme for his time in office is "Global UK – The New Future", supporting businesses through the COVID19 crisis, speeding the recovery and seizing the opportunities of the new future. William has over thirty years' experience in the financial and business City including holding senior positions in the national and international Banking sector. In 1987 he went to work for First Boston Corporation before joining Merrill Lynch in 1992 as an Investment Banker in Institutional Equity Sales, working in Asia, New York and London. William is currently Chair of CDAM, a London based Asset Management business and Senior Advisor to STJ Advisors. William served on the Board of Innovate Finance, the industry body for the UK based Fintech community and is also an educational entrepreneur. He has many charitable interests; he has served as Chair of the Development Board of the Royal Court Theatre, a Board Member of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and on the Council of the Royal Theatrical Support Trust.

Vice Chair and past Chair of the Association of Foreign Banks (AFB) in London and Chair of the Advisory Board of the International Business and Diplomatic Exchange (IBDE)



Sir Roger Gifford is a Senior Banker at SEB in London. He read Chemistry at Oxford University and began his career in the financial sector at S.G. Warburg & Co, joining SEB in 1982. Prior to his appointment as UK Country Head (2000 – 2016) Roger headed the bank's operations in Japan for six years. He has worked in and around the primary debt and equity capital markets most of his career. Roger is Vice Chair and past Chair of the Association of Foreign Banks (AFB) in London and Chair of the Advisory Board of the International Business and Diplomatic Exchange (IBDE). He was Chair of the London Green Finance Initiative launched in 2016 to further the contribution of the financial sector to the G20 climate agenda and chaired the UK Government's Green Finance Taskforce in 2018. Roger is also Chair of the Green Finance Institute, launched in 2019, which has the economics, risk and commercial opportunity of meeting the challenge of climate change as its main focus. Roger was Lord Mayor of The City of London in 2012/13.

In March 2019, he was appointed as the first Chief Sustainable Finance Officer of the Financial Services Agency of Japan or JFSA. Mr. Takada has been working as a government official at the Ministry of Finance since 1995. He has had a wide range of experience in policy-making at the heart of the government including public finance, tax, trade policies and financial services. During over 20 years of his career he spent 5 years in the UK: study at Cambridge and LSE (1997-99), and secondment to HM Treasury (the UK finance ministry, 2003-06) where he worked on financial regulation, investment market policies and public spending. In 2009, Mr. Takada became the first staff of the newly created National Policy Unit and worked in the Prime Minister's Office and the Cabinet Secretariat as an architect of the new public finance framework and as a private advisor to the Prime Minister. After having held senior positions in the Finance Minister's Secretariat responsible for overall coordination and public relations of the Ministry, he was seconded to the OECD, Paris, where he worked as a Senior Policy Analyst at the Green Finance and Investment team, Environment Directorate, from 2015 to 2018. After his return to Tokyo in 2018, Mr. Takada launched the Green Finance Network Japan, an informal network that brings together key players on green finance in Japan from both public and private sectors and provides a platform for collaborating with international stakeholders. In his official capacity, Mr. Takada currently works as the Director of Civil Service Remuneration and Benefits Division, Budget Bureau, Ministry of Finance, and is promoting ESG investments by the national government employees' pension fund. Mr. Takada received a Bachelor degree in Law (University of Tokyo), a Master degree in Law (Cambridge University) and an MBA (Imperial College London).

He joined the Development Bank of Japan (DBJ) in 1990 and took various positions such as Deputy Director of Loan Syndication Unit and Head of Finance Division of Treasury Department. Between 2008 and 2013, he was Director of International Department and in charge of building global business platform of DBJ. In 2013, he was appointed as CEO of DBJ Europe Ltd., DBJ's UK subsidiary, and spent three years to expand DBJ's business in Europe. Hiroyuki became Director General of Treasury Department in 2016. Responsibility ranged from bond issuance including sustainability bonds to money market transactions and execution of ALM derivatives. Since June 2016, he has been serving as CEO of DBJ Securities Co., Ltd. whose business focuses on origination and placement of private equity and infrastructure funds as well as arrangement of green and other thematic bonds. He received B.A. degree in economics from Keio University in 1990 and M.A. in Law and Diplomacy from the Fletcher School of Tufts University in 1997. He was seconded to the International Energy Agency of OECD from 2001 to 2004 where he contributed to producing the World Energy Outlook series.

Mr. Adachi began his career as a researcher at Mitsubishi Research Institute, Inc. in 1986 and then joined The Japan Research Institute, Limited (JRI) in 1990. Currently Counselor at JRI, he previously served in the Management Consulting Department and Technology Research Department. He conducts industrial surveys and corporate evaluations from the perspective of corporate social responsibility. He played a role in issuing the 15th Corporate White Paper by the Japan Association of Corporate Executives in 2003-4. Subsequently, he served as a member of the Japan Association of Corporate Executives' Committee for Promotion of CSR Management working group. Between March 2005 and May 2009, he was one of the experts in the Japanese delegation to the ISO/Social Responsibility Standards (ISO 26000) Working Group. Currently, Mr. Adachi is a member of the Mitsubishi Corporation's Sustainability Advisory Committee and an advisor of The Research Institute for Local Public Transport. From March 2019, he is one of the experts in the Japanese delegation to the ISO TC322 (the technical committee of Sustainable Finance). British Ambassador to Japan



Paul Madden became British Ambassador to Japan in January 2017. He was previously British High Commissioner to Australia (2011-15) and British High Commissioner to Singapore (2007-11). He was Additional Director for Asia Pacific at the FCO in 2015. A career diplomat, he was Managing Director at UK Trade and Investment (2004-2006), responsible for coordinating and implementing international trade development strategies to support companies across a wide range of business sectors. As Assistant Director of Information at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (2003-2004) he was responsible for public diplomacy policy, including managing the FCO funding of the BBC World Service, the British Council and the Chevening Scholarships programme. He led the team responsible for the award-winning UK pavilion at the Aichi Expo in Japan 2005. He was Deputy High Commissioner in Singapore from 2000-2003 and has also served in Washington (1996-2000). Between 1992-96 he worked on EU enlargement and

Environmental issues at the FCO in London. His first posting in Tokyo was as First Secretary Economic (1988-92). Before joining FCO he worked at the Department of Trade and Industry (1980-87) on a range of industrial sectors and trade policy, and was head of the Japan team. He spent two years as a minister's Private Secretary. He has an MA in Economic Geography from Cambridge University, an MBA from Durham University, studied Japanese at London University's School of Oriental and African Studies, and is a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society. His book, *Raffles: Lessons in Business Leadership*, was published in 2003, and his first play was performed in Sydney in 2015. He first visited Japan on a study tour in 1982, after winning an essay contest organized by the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Married to Sarah, with three adult children, he was born in Devon.
